

DANISH GRADING SYSTEM

Danish Grade	Definition	ECTS Grade
12	For an excellent performance displaying a high level of command of all aspects of the relevant material, with no or only a few minor weaknesses.	A
10	For a very good performance displaying a high level of command of most aspects of the relevant material, with only minor weaknesses.	B
7	For a good performance displaying good command of the relevant material but also some weaknesses.	C
4	For a fair performance displaying some command of the relevant material but also some major weaknesses.	D
2	For a performance meeting only the minimum requirements for acceptance.	E
0	For a performance which does not meet the minimum requirements for acceptance.	Fx
-3	For a performance which is unacceptable in all respects.	F

GRADES: The student's performance is assessed according to academic targets set for the specific subject or course (absolute grading method). The relative grading method is not used. Please note that the grades 00 (Fx) and -3 (F) are failing grades. In order to pass a course the student must obtain the grade 02 or a grade above. Any failed courses do not appear on the student's transcript unless this is specifically requested by the student's home university.

CREDITS: In ECTS, 60 credits is the equivalent of a full time workload in one academic year. 30 credits is the equivalent of full time studies in one semester. All students at School of Business and Social Sciences, Aarhus University must enroll in courses totaling 25 to 30 ECTS per semester. Credits are only granted for completed courses.
