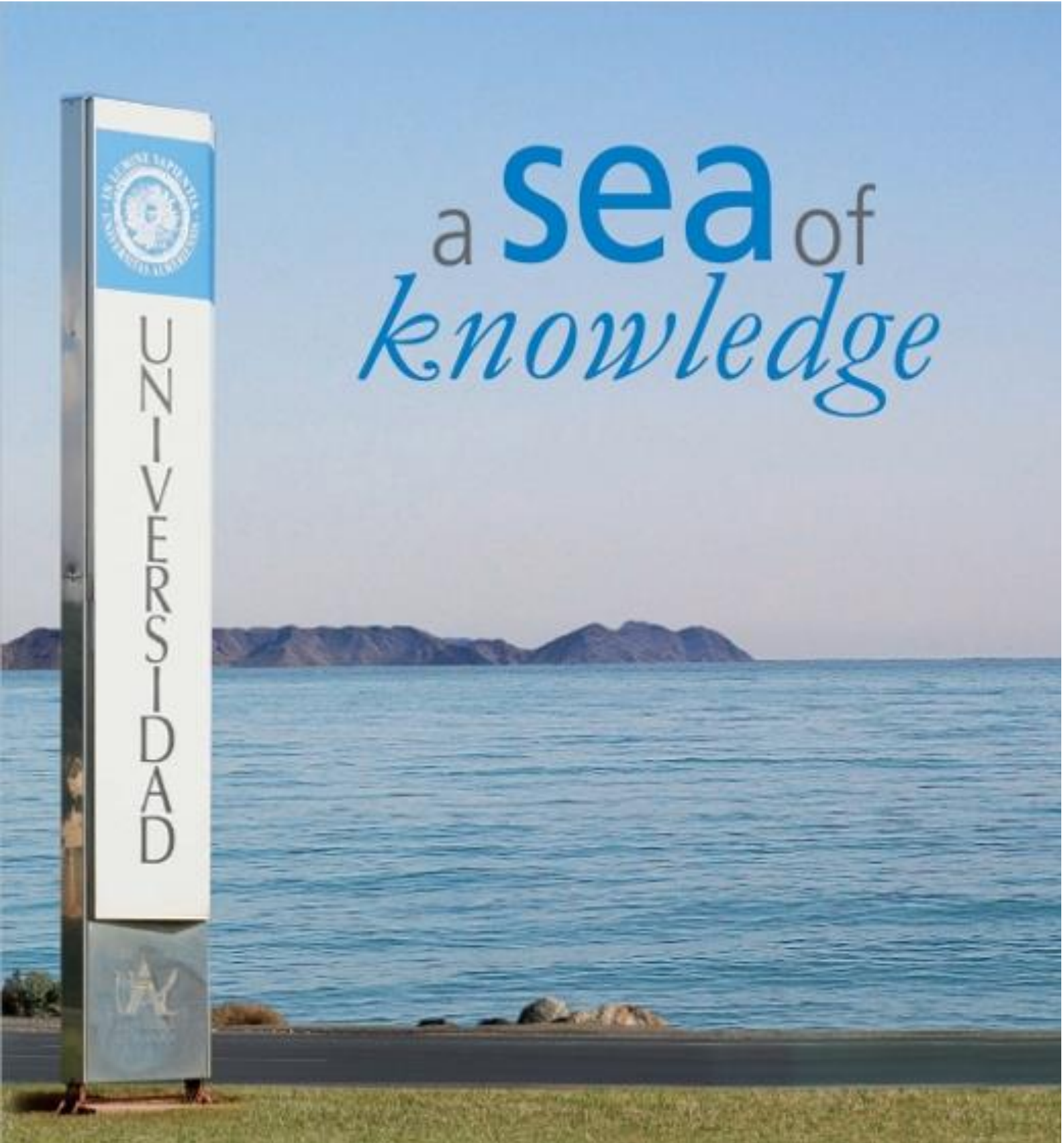

1. THE UNIVERSITY OF ALMERÍA

The University of Almería, **one of the youngest and most dynamic universities of Spain**, with more than 12,000 students, 600 phd students, 100 research groups, and more than 800 lecturers. The university was created by the Andalusian Parliament in 1993 at the behest of the Autonomous Government of Andalusia.

Nowadays, the University of Almería offers the possibility of studying a range of **31 bachelor's degrees, 30 doctoral programmes, 40 official master's programmes and 15 non-official masters' programmes**. The University is also proud of its modern facilities among which we can find four lecture theatres buildings, an auditorium, an indoor sport centre with a swimming pool and outdoor sport tracks and tennis courts. Apart from the bachelor's degree courses, the student can choose from a **broad range of *Enseñanzas propias*** [non-official courses designed by the University] (courses, specialist courses, expert courses, masters programmes, etc.) and a **large offer of cultural and sport activities**, which intend to satisfy academic and non-academic demands, coming not only from the university community but from the society in general. There are more than 20 summer courses every year, which are followed by more than 1300 students. The University of Almería has a solid commitment with research and investigation, featuring in the **third position in the Andalusia scientific production ranking**, with 300 research contracts signed with companies, 70 patents registered and 700 published works.

Mathematics and Computer Engineering: You will find it as CITE III on your timetable. It corresponds to number 25 on the map.

Humanities Building: On your schedule you will find this building as building C and it is the number 17 on the map.

Business Administration Building: You will find it as Building B on your schedule. On the map, it is the number 16.

Educational Sciences Building: You will find it as Building A on your schedule. On the map, it is the number 19.

Legal Sciences: You will find it as D on your timetable. It correspond to the number 18 on the map.

2.4 Library

The University Library promotes the access and dissemination of informative resources. It is a key tool for the creation of student knowledge.

The library offers loaning and bibliographic resources for all students registered in the University of Almería including, of course, all international students. Materials are also available through interlibrary loan. 3.1 International Relations Office

The International Relations Office is the administrative service from the University of Almeria responsible for channeling all internalization and development cooperation initiatives. It organizes and supports national and international mobility programmes for students as well as for professors and staff.

The International Office provides information and assistance before, during and after the mobility process.

The UAL participates in the following exchange and mobility programmes:

ERASMUS+: students from the 28 member states of the EU, the three countries of the European Economic Area (Iceland, Lichtenstein and Norway) and Turkey, within the framework of bilateral agreements.

ANUIES-CRUE: Exchange Programm with Mexican Higher Education Institutions.

PIMA: Program for Academic Exchange and Mobility - The objective of this program is to strengthen inter-university cooperation and encourage the development of the Latin American dimension of higher level education, through the development of multilateral higher level student exchange projects in the region.

ISEP: International Students Exchange Programme. It provides access to a wide range of institutions of higher education in USA, Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, Middle East and Oceania.

UALMUNDO: This programme comprises students from countries whose university has a valid agreement with UAL. We receive students from China, USA, Canada, Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Ecuador, Mexico, Panama and Uruguay among others.

3.4 Orientation Days

Orientation events will be organized by the International Relations Office, the Vicerectorate of Internationalization together with the ESN Office. It is desirable that all international students be present at orientation events since you will obtain all the necessary information concerning the study period in Almeria. These event will take place one week before the beginning of the classes. You will receive information by email about how to participate before your arrival.

3.5 Learning Agreement

You will follow all the steps related to your Learning Agreement on the online platform, Umove. Once we give you access (in June) we will send you detailed information for the completion of each of the steps.

3.6 Checklist

Before your arrival at UAL make sure that:

- ✓ You have registered on the platform.
- ✓ You have received your letter of acceptance.
- ✓ You have selected your courses on Umove (according to your coordinator at your home university).
- ✓ You have uploaded your learning agreement signed by your home university coordinator and yourself.
- ✓ You have enrolled into the courses you have previously selected.
- ✓ You have a health insurance.
- ✓ You have received information about the Orientation Days.
- ✓ You have uploaded your picture to Campus Virtual.

3.7 Academic Coordinator

The figure of the academic coordinator will help you with any academic issues you may have such as the eligibility of your courses or the proper functioning and use of the online learning system.

Your academic coordinator is the one who signs your documents digitally once you have uploaded them to the platform (Umove). Therefore, it is not necessary for him/her to sign them manually.

3.8 Assessment and Grading System

There are two ordinary examination periods per academic year. The first is held at the beginning February and the second one is held in June. Students who do not pass their exams during the ordinary period may retake them during the extraordinary exam period in September. Each student has to attend classes regularly and comply with the professor's requirements in order to pass a given course.

4. PRACTICAL MATTERS

4.1 Internet Access

Students have access to wireless Internet all over the campus. You may also use stationary computers and laptops available at the library. In order to log in you will need your user name and password.

If you need help to connect to the net you can ask at the ESN office.

4.2 Health Insurance

- Students from the EU: The European Health Insurance Card is valid for all European citizens who are spending a period of time in any country of the European Economic Space, that is, the European Union, Norway, Iceland and Switzerland.

The students should contact the authorized insurance agency of their country of origin and apply for the European Health Insurance Card.

However, the European Health Insurance Card has a very limited coverage. The University of Almería recommends you to sign for a private insurance.

- Students from non-European countries: A private insurance is compulsory. The insurance must include repatriation. You must bring with you a copy of your insurance policy to the International Office.
- The University of Almería has an agreement with an insurance company which has special prices for international students:

- Upon arrival in Spain, you should go to the nearest medical centre and fill the application to register temporally in the health care system. An address in Spain is required in order to have a doctor appointed to you. If you were to require medical assistance, you will have the same rights as any Spanish citizen.

4.3 Opening a Bank Account

In accordance with Spanish law, all resident and non resident foreigners with financial affairs in Spain must have foreigners tax identification number or NIE (Número de Identificación de Extranjero).

The NIE is essential for any fiscal transactions where money is paid to the Spanish inland revenue office and this includes **opening a bank account and making any transactions with it.**

Most visa documents already bare the NIE. You can also apply for it in the bank where you want to open the account. They will charge you a small amount of money for the procedure. However, if you need to get one by other means you will find useful the information below.

How to obtain a NIE

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

- An application form (form EX14), filled out and signed (www.mir.es)
- Identity card or original passport and photocopy.
- Documents justifying that you are not in Spain in a irregular situation (Acceptance Letter of the University)

4.4 Visa

International students and researchers coming from outside the schengen area who are wishing to study or conduct research in Spain must be in possession of a visa in order to be able to reside legally in the country.

Researchers or lecturers who have entered Spain with a residence visa which allows them to work without obtaining a work permit, must begin the procedures for obtaining a resident's card within 30 days of their date of arrival in Spain.

5.1 Almería

Almería is located in the South of Spain. It enjoys good weather all the year round. The landscape is varied: you can find coastline, mountains and desert areas.

The region has a rich cultural heritage as a result of its ancient history, which can be seen in many old buildings, some of them now in ruins. The name of Almería comes from the Arab *Al-miraya*, which means “the mirror of the sea”. Almería developed its Spanish roots when the Catholic Monarchs, Fernando and Isabel, conquered the city in 1489 and it became part of the kingdom of Castile. In 1522, Almería was devastated by an earthquake and rebuilding and recovery didn't really get underway until the 19th century thanks to the industry of mining and the exportation of grape. During the Spanish Civil War (1936-1939), the city was shelled by the German Navy, and fell to Franco in 1939. It has since rebuilt its economy around vegetable production, with 100,000 acres of greenhouses, supplying much of Europe.

The University of Almería is a public university, founded in 1993. Nowadays, there are 800 professors and more than 15.000 students. The campus is situated 7 km from Almería, close to the natural park of Cabo de Gata-Níjar.

Monuments and museums

Alcazaba of Almería: Built by Abderramán III, it is a Muslim stronghold with three areas. The first enclosure corresponds to the barracks which could be used as shelter in the event of siege; the second one includes the Arabic palace and the third was built by the Catholic Monarchs after the Christian Reconquest. **Further Information:** http://www.spain.info/en/quienes/arte/monumentos/almeria/alcazaba_de_almeria.html

Civil War Shelter: It was built in 1938 to give shelter to the citizens during the bombings carried out by the Nationalists. Nowadays, it is used as a museum. **Further Information:** <https://www.turismodealmeria.org/en/motivo-tematico/shelters-civil-war/>

Jayrán's Wall and San Cristóbal's Hill: This wall descends through the Ravine of La Hoya and reaches San Cristóbal's Hill, built in the 11th century. In this hill, you can find remains of a Christian keep (often thought as templar). It has the best view of the city and the sea. There is a statue of "el Corazón de Jesús," dating from 1930.

Archaeological museum: It houses archaeological findings located in the county from the prehistoric to the Muslim period, most of which corresponds to excavations carried out by the archaeologist Luis Siret. **Further information:** http://www.spainisculture.com/en/museos/almeria/museo_de_almeria.html

Cathedral: This is the only fortified cathedral in Spain which was designed in the 16th century with a dual role: as a place of worship, but also to protect the citizens when pirates attacked the city of Almeria after the Reconquest. The cathedral was constructed on the site of a mosque. **Further Information:** http://www.spain.info/en/quieres/arte/monumentos/almeria/catedral_de_almeria.html

Cinema's Museum: The House of the Cinema makes a tour through the cinematographic past of the province of Almería and preserves the historical memory. The city hall bought it for its reconversion into a Museum since has a great connection with the world of the cinema. **Further Information:** <https://www.turismodealmeria.org/en/motivo-tematico/the-house-of-cinema/>

Cabo de Gata Natural Park: It is Andalucía's largest coastal protected area, a wild and isolated landscape with some of Europe's most original geological features. There are numerous tiny rocky islands and underwater extensive coral reefs. Its climate is arid to the extent of being the driest location in Europe and the continent's only subtropical or "warm" desert, with average yearly temperatures above 18 °C. In 1997 it was designated as a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. **Further Information:** <http://www.cabogataspain.com/>

Tabernas Dessert: It is considered the only proper desert in Europe. The site offers a variety of environmental resources, especially geological ones. Under a semiarid Mediterranean climate, with rainfall that does not reach 250 mm annually and average temperatures above 17 °C. These conditions have favoured the formation of Mediterranean boulevards, known as "bad lands." **Further Information:** <http://www.andalucia.org/en/natural-spaces/nature-site/desierto-de-tabernas/>

5.2 Accommodation

Students have the opportunity to stay in the new dormitory of the UAL, for the full year or just for a few days. The dormitory will be open even during the summer months. It is well located, with close bus stops to get to the university, and in an area where students can find shops, sports facilities and entertainment venues. Students can book a room through the web <http://www.residenciacivitas.com/>

Students in Almería also live in **shared flats**. The Erasmus Students Association will help you upon arrival to contact other students and landlords so you can settle down as soon as possible. Nevertheless, finding the right place to live could take a few days depending on your needs and budget. If you don't have accommodation upon your arrival, we recommend staying in the Youth Hostel for the first days (see [Almería Youth Hostel](#)).

Sharing flat with other students...

They are normally private self-catered flats fully furnished with kitchen, bathroom, a living room and three or four bedrooms. The flats always have blankets, however, they never have towels and sometimes there are sheets available.

A single room costs approximately €200 to €300 per month depending on the characteristics of the apartment. Some options affecting the price may include: en-suite facilities, telephone lines and network connections. You should be required to sign a tenancy agreement. The landlord or intermediate agency may ask for a deposit (usually one or two month's rent). The deposit is refundable if you do not damage the property and pay all bills on the property. It should be refunded to you at the end of the tenancy.

5.3 How to arrive to Almería

By plane: Almería airport is located in the outskirts, approximately 10 Km away from the city centre. There is a bus router linking the airport with Almería (line 22). Price: 1,05 € Departures from 06:35 h to 22:45 h every 70 minutes. <http://surbus.es/pdf/aeropuerto.pdf> Another alternative is to take a taxi. Price: 15 € approx.

The Cost of living in Almería is not so high in comparison with other European cities.

- ✦ Coffee: 1-1,2 €
- ✦ Food: 8-12 € (set menu)

- ✦ Shops and other supermarkets - From 9 to 14 and from 17 to 20 hours.
- ✦ Public services: post office, health care, etc. – From 9:00 to 14:00 hours.
- ✦ Banks: generally - from 8:00 to 14:00 hours.
